NJ Emergency Services Health & Fitness Coalition Introduction

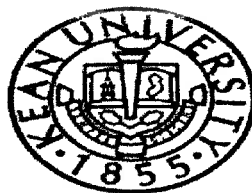

NJ Emergency Services Health & Fitness Coalition – What it is and why it's important to you.

November 2014 the Line of Duty Death (LODD) of a fairly young and in good shape firefighter was the final straw. It was that event that prompted the NJ Division of Fire Safety Director William Kramer, Mount Laurel Fire Department Battalion Chief Greg Collier and I to meet to discuss the concerning health issues of firefighter and emergency responders in general. It had come to the boiling point. It was enough talk. Time for action. 2014 was the year we had 6 firefighters die in the LODD from Cardiovascular disease. There was an abundance of research and data that clearly showed that firefighter fitness was clearly related to the LODDs, as well as their ability to function adequately on the fireground. Enough was enough. Time to do something about it.

Through our brainstorming session that day, we came up with the concept of creating a coalition of fire and emergency services stakeholders to address these issues. A coalition that would become self-sustaining. We also decided to add firefighter cancer and emergency responder mental health to the coalition's mission, since we were also having alarming rates of deaths from these causes. We also included those knowledgeable of the health issues we were about to take action against. We wanted as many of the major stakeholders in the state of NJ who were impacted by firefighter and emergency responder death and disability. We included chief's organizations, unions, volunteer organizations. Representatives from the League of Municipalities and the Joint Insurance Fund. Organizations such as the National Fallen Firefighters Foundation (NFFF), Firefighter Cancer Foundation, FirstTwenty and Firefighter function fitness. FDNY Behavioral Health Section. NJ Division of Fire Safety, NJ office of Emergency Medical Services, NJ Public Employees Occupational Health & Safety (PEOSH) and more.

Our plan was to hold a Health Summit to bring these stakeholders together and develop a strategic plan of how to move forward and address these health issues. We planned for over 18 months to get

Various obstacles and time constraints kept holding us up from setting a date. The services of Kent Neiswender of NJ DFS and Kean University were added to this project by Director Kramer. With the

To develop a long term, sustainable plan to address the impact of health related illnesses in the Fire Service.

The Coalition meets every 2 months at a physical site, as well as extending participation by webinar. The coalition has now grown to over 50 participants dedicated to improving the mental and physical health of fire and emergency responders in NJ through collaboration and cooperation.

Since the creation of The Coalition we have:

- Created a class on the physiological and mental stressors of firefighting which has been delivered 6 times through Kean University to over 100 class participants.
- Delivered 6 NFFF Stress First Aid classes through Kean.
- Developed a report on recommended fire recruit functional fitness guidelines
- Collaborate with the NJ Office Of EMS Safety Committee
- Provided the NJ Division of Fire Safety a Bulletin on Suicide Prevention Awareness
- Provided NJ Division of Fire Safety a bulletin on reducing cancer hazards to firefighters.
- Created a resource library.

We are currently working on:

First Annual Fire & Emergency Services Health & Fitness Symposium. Being planned for November / December 2017 timeline

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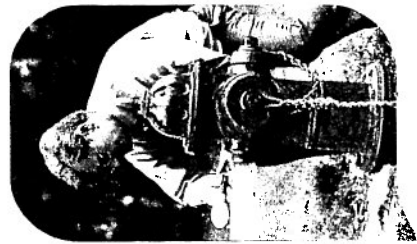

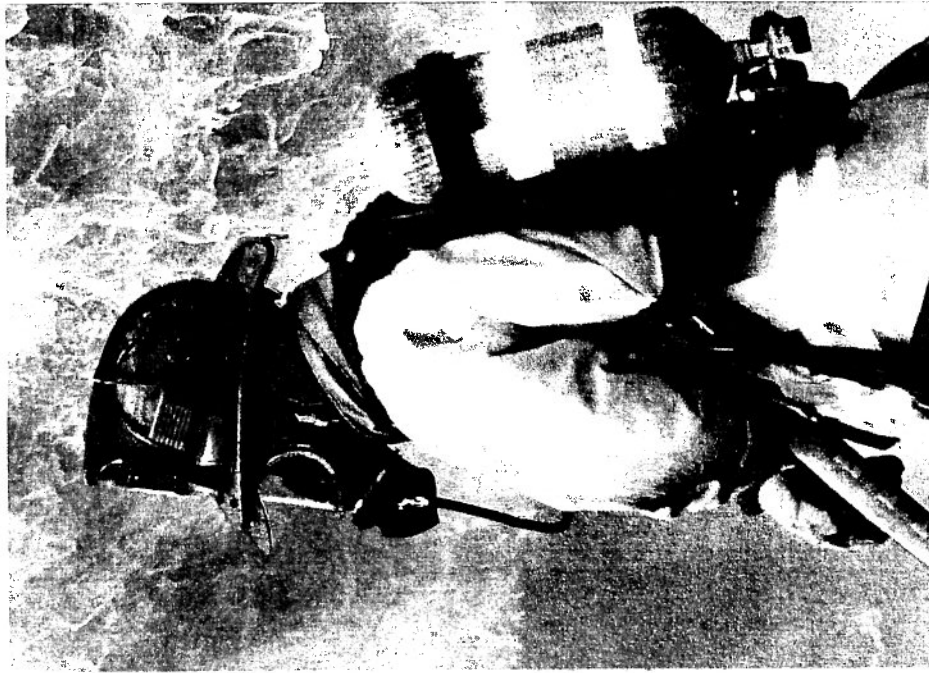

ELECTION DATE CHANGE

A1690, Dancer, Singleton/**SCS 660/2002**, Turner, Beach - Establishes procedures for boards of fire commissioners to move annual fire district elections to November, eliminates certain fire district budget referenda and eliminates certain fire district capital purchase referenda.

THIS HAS BEEN SIGNED INTO LAW! P.L. 2017, c. 206.

*In addition to our four prime sponsors, we ended up with 12 additional co-sponsors:
Assemblymen Andrzejczak, Land, Benson, Moriarty, Houghtaling, Eustace, McGuckin and Wolfe;
Assemblywoman Downey and Mosquera and Senator Gordon.*

Much thanks needs to go to our sponsors, Assemblyman Ron Dancer, Assemblyman Troy Singleton and Senator Jim Beach.

Some key provisions:

It is PERMISSIVE;

*Fire districts themselves are the **only** entities that can initiate the change (the school board legislation allows municipalities or a voter petition to initiate the change);*

It provides clarity and fairness regarding the process approving for capital purchases AND what constitutes a capital purchase;

Removes voter referenda for non-financed capital purchases (including those funded by a tax increases as long as it remains under the two-percent cap);

To establish the necessary alignment of election and fire district lines in municipalities with multiple fire districts EITHER the fire district lines OR the election district lines may be moved.

FIRE SAFETY COMMISSION MEMBERSHIP

A5076, Wisniewski – Increases membership of fire safety commission by four members who shall be “members of the public who are knowledgeable and experienced in matters related to fire safety.

Introduced on June 29 and referred to the Assembly State and Local Government Committee

WATER COMPANY MANDATES

A4805, Mosquera – Prohibits water companies from assessing more than one charge per fire hydrant to fire departments, fire districts or volunteer fire companies for use of fire hydrants.

A4806, Mosquera – Requires water companies to provide representative of fire department, fire district or volunteer fire company access fire hydrants for water flow rate testing purposes.

Both bills were introduced on May 18 and referred to the Assembly State and Local Government Committee.

NO further action on these bills and no Senate sponsors yet.

REGULATORY COMPLIANCE FOR POST-RETIREMENT VOLUNTEER FIRE FIGHTERS

A536, Schepisi/**S2107**, Sarlo - Provides PERS or PFRS member who continues to be volunteer fire fighter after retirement with employer from whom member retires has bona fide severance from employment for compliance with NJ Regulations and IRS Code.

Both bills were heard and released by the Assembly Law and Public Safety Committee on May 11 and subsequently amended on the floor on May 22. S2107 passed the Senate in June 2016.

No further action on these bills.

SPECIAL NEEDS REGISTRY

S2436, Bateman/**A3784**, Zwicker – Establishes a registry of persons with special needs for use during emergencies.

*S2435 was heard and released by the Senate Law and Public Safety Committee on May 8. It was second referenced to Senate Budget. **No further action on these bills. We are in the process of determining if fire districts need to be explicitly named among the entities that are to receive the listing.***

Uniform Fire Code: N.J.A.C. 5:70-2.21

New Rule

Establishes requirements for identifying emblems for structures with solar panels.

AGREEMENT FOR SHARED SERVICES

THIS AGREEMENT made this 12th day of December , **2017**, by and between the **TOWNSHIP OF EAST BRUNSWICK**, a municipal corporation of the State of New Jersey, having its principal offices located at 1 Jean Walling Civic Center Drive, East Brunswick, NJ, hereinafter referred to as “Township,” and the **EAST BRUNSWICK FIRE DISTRICT #_3_**, a public entity of the State of New Jersey, having its principal offices located at 363 Dunhams Corner Road , hereinafter referred to as “Fire District.”

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:65-1 et seq., a municipality may enter into agreements for shared services with another public entity to provide or receive any service that the units participating in the agreement are empowered to provide or receive within their own jurisdiction; and

WHEREAS, it is the intent and purpose of the “Act” to encourage economy and regionalization of services as well as Shared Service Agreements to eliminate unnecessary duplication of effort and fees; and

WHEREAS, each local unit authorized to enter into an agreement under the Shared Services and Consolidation Act must do so by the adoption of a resolution; and

WHEREAS, the agreement must comply with the requirements of N.J.S.A. 40A:65-7 and specify the services to be performed under the agreement, procedures for payment, and assignment and allocation of responsibility for meeting standards between and among the parties; and

WHEREAS, Township has a need for Fire Department services; and

WHEREAS, the Fire District has a need for domestic water and domestic water services; and

WHEREAS, the parties desires to enter into a Shared Service Agreement for the exchange of the above mentioned services.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants and commissions hereinafter set forth pursuant to the authority provided by law, the Township and Fire District mutually agree as follows:

1. Scope of Services: The Township shall be entitled to receive Fire Department services from the Fire District. Specifically, the Fire District will assist the Township with the search for missing persons, respond and assist police calls for water and ice rescue, assist the Police Department with forcible entry into buildings for police related calls, assist police with specialized equipment such as inferred camera / ladders / entry tools etc, provide lighting for crime and accident scenes, provide mobile Public Address alert and warning capability and assist with various community events such as Law Enforcement Torch Run, Community Day, and 4th of July. . In exchange for the above-mentioned services, the Fire District shall be entitled to receive domestic water and related domestic water services.

2. Responsibility: At all times, the Fire District shall maintain the responsibility for and control over the Fire District's equipment necessary to provide services to the Township. Additionally, at all times, the Township shall maintain responsibility for and control over all Township equipment necessary to provide services to the Fire District.

3. Fee: It is acknowledged by both parties that the cost for services provided by the Fire District is reasonably equivalent to the domestic water services provided by the Township to the Fire District. If the cost of domestic water service charges or services provided by the Fire District increase substantially, the cost analysis may be revisited by the parties.

4. Term: This Shared Service Agreement shall become effective on the date the contract is fully executed by both the Township and the Fire District and continue in full force and effect for a period of ten years.

5. **Termination:** Either party may cancel this Shared Service Agreement on written notice to the other.

6. **Amendment:** No change or modification of any of the covenants, terms or provisions hereof shall be valid unless in writing and executed by the Mayor or Administrator of each party or his/her designated representative and specifies the date the provisions of such amendment shall be effective.

7. The covenants and agreements herein contained shall inure to the benefit of, be binding upon the successors, heirs, executors, administrators and assigns of the parties hereto, respectively.

8. The Agreement shall be governed by and construed under the laws of the State of New Jersey.

9. The provisions of the Agreement are severable and it is the intention of the parties hereto that if this Agreement cannot take effect in its entirety because of the final judgment of any Court of competent jurisdiction, holding invalid any part or parts thereof, the remaining provisions of the Agreement shall be given full force and effect as completely as if parts held invalid had not been included therein.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, the parties hereto have caused this Agreement to be executed by its proper Officers and its corporate seals to be hereto affixed, as of the day and year first above written.



Adoption of Temporary Budget for 2018

WHEREAS, it has become necessary for the Commissioners of Fire District No. 3 in the Township of East Brunswick, County of Middlesex, by resolution, to adopt a temporary budget to make appropriations and to provide for the period between the beginning of the fiscal year, January 1, 2018, and the adoption of the budget by the legal voters of the fire district, which election is scheduled for February 17, 2018.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it RESOLVED by the Commissioners of Fire District No. 3 in the Township of East Brunswick, County of Middlesex, as follows:

(1) A temporary budget is hereby adopted to be effective from the beginning of the fiscal year as noted above and to be in full force and effect until the adoption of the annual fire district budget as referenced above; the total of the appropriations of the temporary budget to reflect not in excess of 14% of the total of the appropriations made for all purposes in the budget for the preceding fiscal year exclusive of appropriations for interest and debt redemption charges and capital improvements.
